## **MORSE CODE INSPECTORS!**

This term, KS1 have been learning about the various methods used for communication in the past, and how these methods differ to the forms of communication that are most commonly use today.

We have been exploring the use of telegrams and discovering how messages were translated from dots and dashes to letters and words through the application of Morse code. The students translated some secret messages and even wrote Morse code of their own!



#### **KS2 EXPLORING POETRY**



KS2 have been exploring poetry with well-known children's poets, Robert Louis Stevenson and Anne Fine. Our poetry sessions have provided students with an opportunity to express their feelings and develop their imaginations!

Following a mastery approach the students have been diving into addition and subtraction. This has allowed students to build on their current knowledge, whilst at the same time being challenged through different forms of deeper problem solving.

### **KS1's SNOW INVESTIGATIONS**

In science, KS1 have been focusing on the properties of different materials. A covering of mid-January snowfall offered a wonderful opportunity for the students to investigate the various properties of water under changing conditions. We discussed the texture of the snow, and the changes that occur to it before it begins to melt. The students had a chance to share their predictions and watched eagerly as day by day the snow began to thaw.
