Headteacher's Welcome

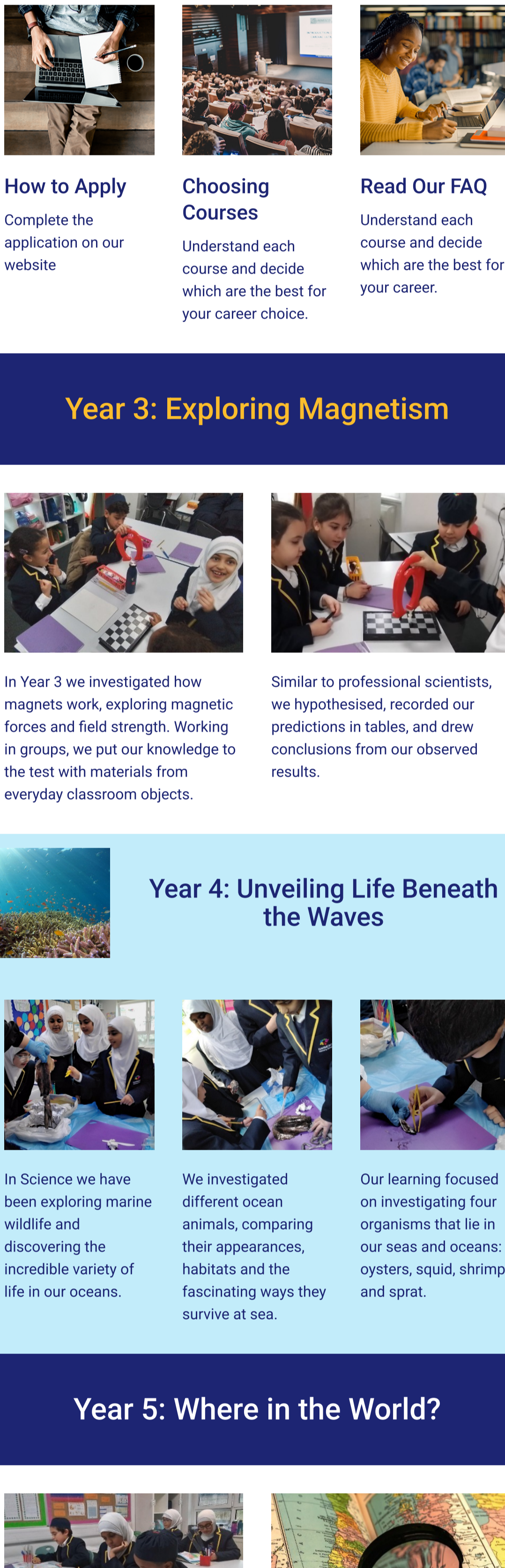
Assalamu ^alaykum wa raHmutallahi wa barakatuh,

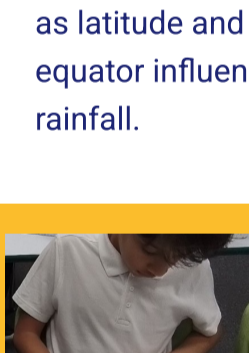

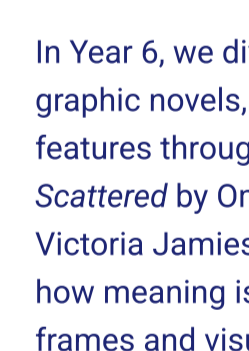
Learning Highlights

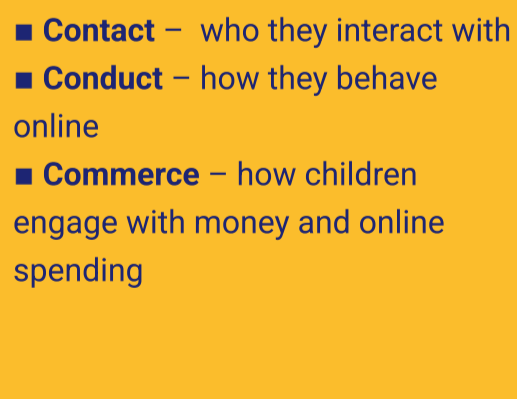

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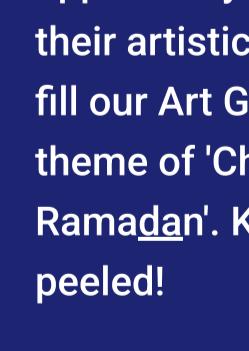
Year 3: Exploring Magnetism



In Year 3 we investigated how magnets work, exploring magnetic forces and field strength. Working in groups, we put our knowledge to the test with materials from everyday classroom objects.

In Science we have been exploring marine wildlife and discovering the incredible variety of life in our oceans.

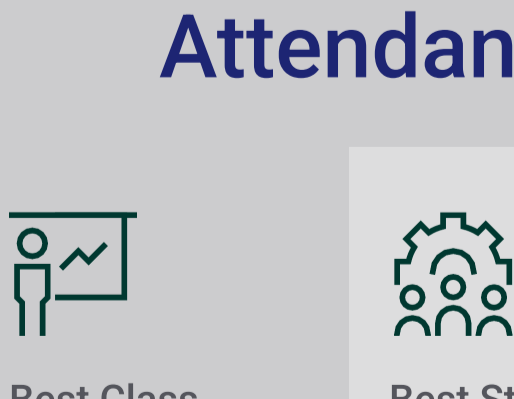


We investigated different ocean animals, comparing their appearances, habitats and the fascinating ways they survive at sea.

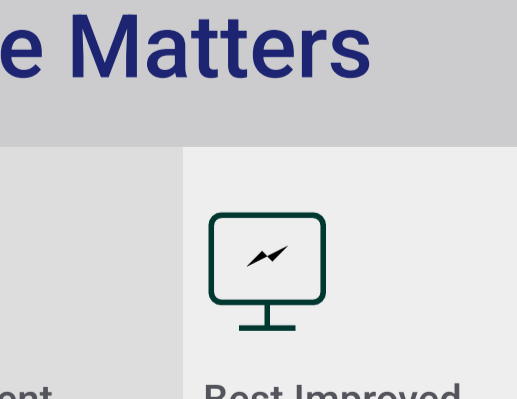


Our learning focused on investigating four organisms that lie in our seas and oceans: oysters, squid, shrimp, and sprat.

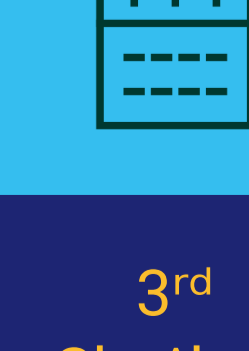
Year 5: Where in the World?



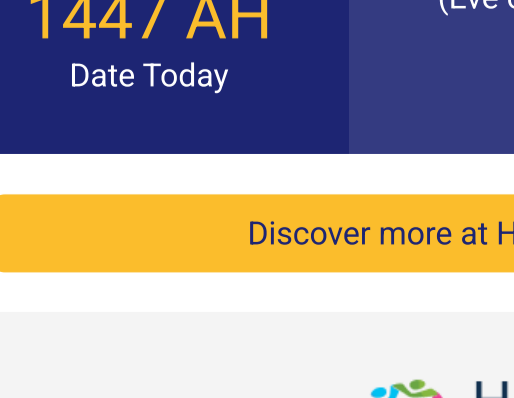
This term Year 5 pupils explored the world map to understand how a place's location affects its climate. We investigated how factors such as latitude and proximity to the equator influence temperature and rainfall.



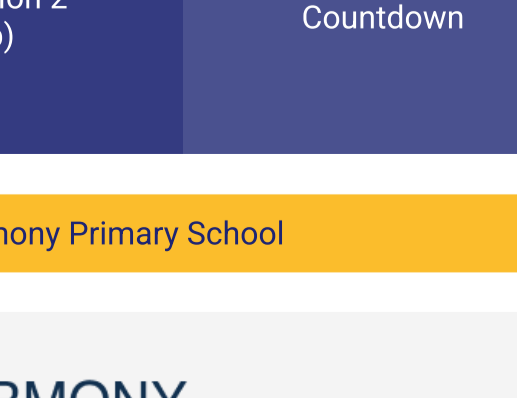
We made links between climate zones and vegetation patterns, developing a deeper understanding of how our planet's physical features are interconnected.



Year 6: A picture is worth a thousand words



In Year 6, we dived into the world of graphic novels, exploring key features through *When Stars Are Scattered* by Omar Mohamed and Victoria Jamieson. We focused on how meaning is created through frames and visual choices.



Then, we planned our own comic pages, paying close attention to layout, expression, and dialogue. Finally, we designed original graphic novel based on our plans, showcasing thoughtful storytelling.

To help keep our pupils safe online, we use the 4 Cs of Online Safety to assess potential risks and decide whether content, contact, behaviour, or online transactions are suitable for their age.



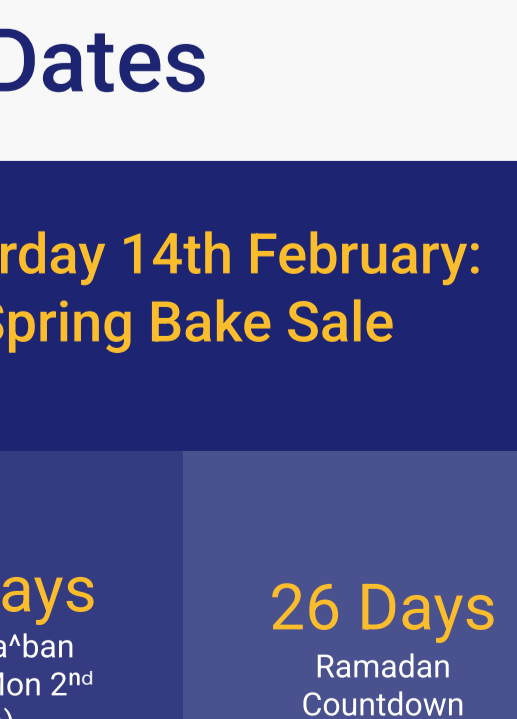
The 4 Cs are:
■ **Content** – what children see online
■ **Contact** – who they interact with
■ **Conduct** – how they behave online
■ **Commerce** – how children engage with money and online spending



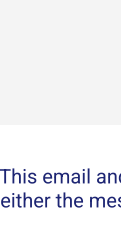
This framework highlights how risks can appear in digital spaces. By staying vigilant in this area, we can support our pupils in becoming safe, responsible digital citizens.

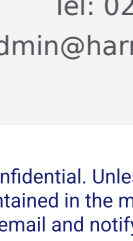

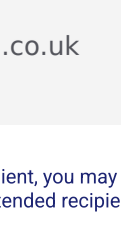
